1. Minutes passed as presented
2. Craft Fair, looking for volunteers. Grade 7's doing concession. Janet Sheard is sponsoring the Craft Fair and new signs were made.
3. Hallowe'en Dance - volunteer form circulated
4. Christmas Family sponsorship - request of 3-4 families with 6 kids total; ornament tree to be used again as it worked so well. Spring food drive discuss and competition on how to do it.
5. Purdy's will go home on Nov. $16^{\text {th }}$ - online only and order deadline November 25.
6. Clothing Drive will be November 1-14, pickup on the $15^{\text {th }}$. Portable is full so it will be moved to the stage.
7. PAC Contribution is low compared to past years; currently at 700 down from 1500 last year. We need to state what the funds are used for more clearly as well as the difference between PAC volunteer time vs. classroom volunteer time. Reissue in January or February with list of what purchases we have used. Discussion on how forms are best submitted to PAC from teachers.
8. Floor Hockey: Mr. Taylor talked about floor hockey equipment and sticks. They are better \& more durable for school use. Uses a wiffell ball and totally different rules. Options are right and left handed sticks or flat blade (favoured options). 2 lessons would be provided to teachers to go over the new floor ball rules. A few schools in Surrey are doing this. Large learning curve for hockey players but easily managed. Class set is $\$ 1330$ ( 30 sticks). It is a fun opportunity for everyone not necessarily official league play. Approved to spend $\$ 1330$ on floor ball equipment from gaming grant funds.
9. Dilwali celebration planned for school. Pakora for all the classes in the morning and glabie in the afternoon - all nut free. $\$ 350$ for food and bangra group for assembly. Full decorations and full Indian dress encouraged. Chai tea in afternoon as well. We can look at using volunteer dance groups. We will ask for a $\$ 2$ donation to cover costs. We woul dlaso like to do a Chinese New Year Celebration in New Year. Can we give \$300 to this? Vote Approved.
